जाता है। लड़का है तो उसके घर में ख़ुशी का माहौल छा जायेगा वहीं लड़की हुई तो गुनाह समझा जाता है। घर वाले बोलते हैं कि गर्भपात करा दो, अगर वह औरत गर्भपात के लिए तैयार नहीं होती है तो उसके पति, जो ससुराल में अपना होता है , वह भी उसका साथ नहीं देता । जब लड़की का जन्म होता है तो उसके घर में जैसे एक बहुत बड़ा गुनाह हुआ है वैसा ग़मगीन माहौल बन जाता है । जब लोग पूछते हैं कि क्या हुआ ? तो घर वाले बोलते हैं कि लड़की तो हुई है । यह सुनते ही प्रतिक्रिया होती है - 'आह लड़की हुई है बेचारे का तो भाग्य ही फूट गया। भगवान भी पता नहीं ऐसे क्यों करते हैं ? बेचारे को एक लड़का हो जाता तो कितना अच्छा लगता।' ये जो बोल रही होती है वो भी एक महिला है । इस सोच को जब तक महिलाएं नहीं बदलेंगी तो महिला कभी भी सशक्त नहीं हो सकती है । पहले हमें अपने आप को बदलना होगा तभी घर का माहौल बदलेगा , घर का माहौल बदलेगा तो समाज बदलेगा और तभी देश बदलेगा । सरकार की नीतियाँ ही काफी नहीं हैं । - अंकिता कुमारी (First Year B.Ed., 2019-21)
