# **Teaching Learning Materials | Exhibition**

An exhibition of teaching-learning materials was organised on the 15th August 2021 by the students of second years under the guidance of our Visual Arts teacher Roshan Kumar. Practice teaching is a very important component of a student-teacher's training. Students of the second years are required to do 16 weeks of practice teaching in local schools as part of their curriculum specified by National Council for Teachers Education, a statutory body of the Government of India to monitor standards, procedures and processes in the Indian Education system.

Due to the second wave of the pandemic, students could not intern in schools. As an alternative measure, intensive and programmed peer-teaching sessions was organised in the college for the students to practice their teaching skills and to get a feel for a real classroom. The sessions were 19th July to 14th August 2021.

### Inclusive Education - Attitude of Teachers

They are deemed a burden to be tolerated in the school and in society. This has led to their exclusion from normal life, a significant erosion of our constitutional values. Many believe that inclusive education is the answer to learning acceptance of other people and people with unique abilities.

Inclusive education is a system that accommodates all learners - children and young people with or without disabilities - in a common education system to learn and grow together in a conducive environment. Stakeholders in the system - the learners, their parents, the community, the teachers, administrators, and policymakers, are encouraged to embrace diversity, and see special learners as opportunities.

Inclusive education promotes wider social acceptance, peace, and cooperation. It accepts children with special needs into

the regular classroom, accepts their diversity, respects their individuality, and creates opportunities for their full participation in every aspect of schooling, to enable them to reach their optimum potential.

The attitude of teachers is important to the success of an inclusive classroom, an inclusive school, and an inclusive society.



A study on teachers' attitudes, based on a sample of 108 pre-service & in-service teachers from 11 primary and secondary government and private schools of Gaya (Bihar), led to some interesting findings.

Pre-service teachers revealed a more favorable attitude towards inclusive education than in-service teachers. Urban teachers had a more favorable attitude than rural teachers. However, there was no significant difference between the attitude of male and female teachers towards inclusive education.
