As the academic year draws to a close, we find ourselves looking back—with pride, with questions, and with renewed resolve. From February to June, Amaltas College of Education has been alive with academic rigor, cultural celebration, and the kind of learning that happens when students, faculty, and community come together with purpose.

We are proud to share two meaningful milestones from this term. Shri Shashi Kumar Shekhar, Assistant Professor, was invited by the University Grants Commission (UGC) to serve as a resource person at a six-day basic training programme on Indian Knowledge Systems (IKS), hosted by the Malaviya Mission Teacher Training Centre at the Central University of South Bihar. As a certified IKS Master Trainer, he delivered his first set of lectures on 8th and 9th March 2025—a significant step in his academic journey, and a quiet moment of pride for our entire college community.

And in equally celebratory news, Prithwi Raj, Assistant Professor, was awarded his Ph.D. in Education this term. His achievement is a testament to years of focused research and scholarship, and we are proud to have him as part of our faculty team.

Our B.Ed. 2nd year students (2023–25) appeared for their final university examinations in May, and, after a demanding and fulfilling term, our faculty began their summer break on 25th May.

D.El.Ed. 1st and 2nd year university exams will be held in June. This means we expect to begin 2nd year D.El.Ed. classes on time. However, the B.Ed. 1st year exams are scheduled for July, which will delay the start of their next academic session. Admissions for both B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. also remain stalled, with no announcements yet. The new academic year was supposed to begin on 1st July, but at this point, it is impossible to plan for incoming students.

These ongoing delays compress the academic year, giving us less time with students who need more, not less. They also makes it impossible to meet the NCTE-mandated 200 working days, a critical standard designed to ensure quality teacher preparation. We hope the University and Bihar Government recognize the urgency of this issue for the sake of all stakeholders.

Meanwhile, as we wait for decisions beyond our control, we strive to keep moving forward, even when the system around us falters.





Academic Update 2024-25

Internship Training

B.Ed. (2023-25)

The B.Ed. 2nd Year students began their 16-week school internship on 15th October 2024 and successfully completed it on 1st February 2025. The internship offered valuable classroom exposure and a first opportunity to apply their training in real school settings.

D.El.Ed. (2023-25)

The D.El.Ed. 2nd Year students began their 14-week school internship on 12th November 2024 and completed it on 15th February 2025. In addition to their classroom responsibilities in four primary and middle schools, they also undertook two weeks of community work. Their active participation in Pratham's Teaching at the Right Level (TaRL) initiative for Grades 3–5 continued to be a key component of the internship.

B.Ed. & D.El.Ed. (2024-26)

The first-year students of both B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. programs completed their one-month school internship from 4th February to 1st March 2025. Placed across 10 local schools, 100 students had their first exposure to classroom realities, applying micro-teaching techniques, conducting case studies, and initiating small-scale action research projects.

Internal Exams

Between April and May 2025, students across all four batches undertook their internal examinations as a key milestone in their academic journey.

The B.Ed. 2nd Year (2023-25) cohort completed their exams from 10th to 15th April, followed by the D.El.Ed. 2nd Year (2023-25) students, who appeared from 9th to 14th May. Shortly thereafter, the B.Ed. 1st Year (2024-26) batch wrote their exams between 13th and 20th May, alongside the D.El.Ed. 1st Year (2024-26) students, who completed theirs by 21st May.

Final Exams and External Viva: B.Ed. 2nd Year (2023-25)

The B.Ed. 2nd Year students appeared for their final university examinations from 5th to 15th May 2025. This was followed by their external viva held in the college on 16th May. For the first time, the students were required to present their learning from the 16-week school internship and face a formal external interview conducted by university-appointed examiners.

College Excursion to Bodhgaya

On 16th February 2025, fifty-one 2nd Year students, accompanied by faculty, visited Bodh Gaya. They explored the Mahabodhi Temple, Great Buddha Statue, Buddha Smriti Park and Museum, and the local market. Beyond being a welcome change of pace, the excursion offered students a chance to engage with Bihar's cultural and spiritual heritage—an experience that enriches their understanding of the world and adds depth to their journey as future educators.
